HEALTHY BABIES

PREGNANCY AND POSTPARTUM MEDICAID COVERAGE

Are you having a baby?

You can get free health care even if you do not legally reside in the United States.

Medicaid may be able to help. Medicaid, which is the same thing as Medical Assistance, pays for health care for people who cannot afford it.

Sign up for Medicaid as soon as you know you are pregnant. Get the care you and your baby need right away. You may keep Medicaid up to four months after your baby is born.

Pregnant Women can now enroll in Medicaid even if they are not U.S. citizens or legally residing in the United States.

To be eligible, you have to be:

- Pregnant
- Living in Maryland
- Low-income

Medical Assistance/Medicaid will not impact a person's future immigration status.

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security states that a person, or a person's family members, can take advantage of Medicaid, SNAP, WIC, and other non-cash benefits. These benefits are not considered "public charge" and will have no bearing on future green card or citizenship or other immigration issue.

WHAT IS FENTANYL?

Fentanyl is a highly addictive opioid and can cause overdose and death.



- Pill-shaped, powdered-form blocks that look like chalk
- 50 times stronger than heroin and 100 times stronger than morphine
- The fentanyl equivalent of 10-15 grains of salt is enough to kill someone

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE SYMPTOMS OF SUBSTANCE USE IN AN ADOLESCENT?



- Mixing with different groups of people or changing friends
- Neglecting school or home responsibilities; losing interest in school and activities
- Change in sleeping habits - sleeping at odd hours
- Mood swings
- Paranoia
- Secretive and suspicious behaviors
- Giving up hobbies, sports, and socializing

If you think your child might be taking opioids and need help, start by calling the 24-hour Montgomery County Crisis Center

Provides support to internationally educated nurses, physicians, behavioral health, and other health professionals to obtain licensure and certification to return to the health field workforce and practice in Maryland.

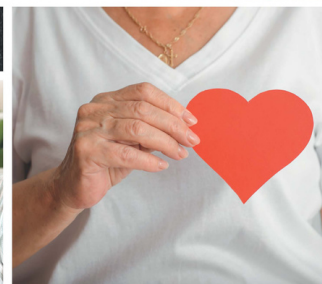
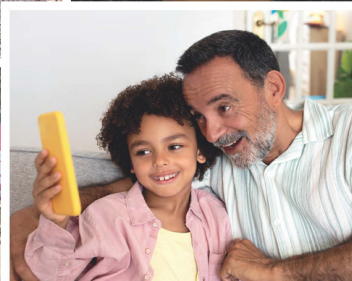
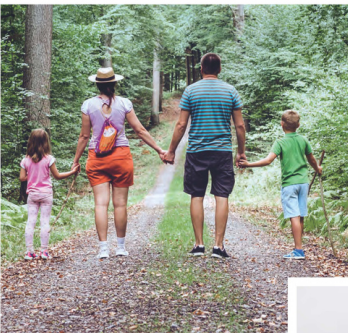
